## Weather Report Given For Upper Canyon

According to weatherman, Irene Paulin, Detroit had its first taste of winter when the thermometer dropped to an average high of 54 degrees, with a high of 59 on the 2nd, 9th, and 12th.

The average low for the month was 33 degrees with 40 degrees on the 3rd and a low of 24 degrees on the 28th, 29th and 30th. There were three days at 32 degrees, three at 31 degrees, three at 28 degrees and two at 27 and 26 degrees.

Rainfall on the 4th measured 2.42 inches. There were only 11 days of rain, with a total for the month of 4.55 inches.

On the brighter side, the first half of the month was mostly sunny with a high of 60 degrees on the 3rd, with an average high of 54 degrees and a low of 39 degrees on the 16th.

Light snow topped the mountains on the 15th and 16th and 17th, with only a brief flurry in Detroit on the 16th which melted on touching the ground.

The last two weeks showed light morning fogs and heavy frosts. Also gusty winds.

Nineteen sunny days with no rain and plenty of sun.

To coin a phrase in Mrs. Paulin's own words, "not too bad for winter's beginning."
