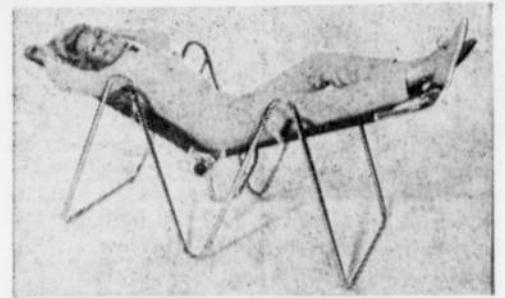
Detroit Catholic Services Changed
