### New Campsite Regulations Set

A revised regulation in the Oregon Campsite Reservation System that makes it possible for anyone to make campsite reservations rather than "Oregonians only" was announced by the Oregon State Highway Commission.

The new campsite regulation will apply only to Oregon's 10 most popular state parks, as previously listed. Those included are Fort Stevens, Cape Lookout, Beverly Beach, Beachside, Jessie M. Honeyman, Umatilla Lighthouse, Sunset Bay, Detroit Lake, The Cove Palisades, and Prineville Reservoir.

A number of objections to the stipulation that Oregonians only could make campsite reservations caused the Commission to change its former ruling. All other state parks remain on the first-come, first-served basis.

Other regulations relative to campsites, as previously announced, remain the same.

Information is available from the main office of the State Parks and Recreation Division, Room 300, State Highway Building, Salem, or from district park offices in Portland, Salem, North Bend, LaGrande, and Bend, and at the various parks throughout the state.
