The group visited Champoeg State park museum, where a State park guide explained the items in the museum and along with many photo's of the first white residence of the area, was a newspaper giving the account of president Lincoln's assassination. Also a hand made flag with only 45 stars.

Next, was a visit to the D.A.R. Pioneer Mothers Memorial Log cabin, which was completely furnished with furnishings of that period.

Then the Robert Newell house which was built in 1852 and furnished during that period.

One of the interesting rooms has the inaugural gowns worn by each of the Oregon governor's wives.

The tour was finished by a side trip to the Ox Barn Museum at Aurora.

This featured 3 different buildings, each one containing furnishings and different craft tools of the colony.

This colony settled in the Aurora area in 1856 and was the first Christian Communal colony in the Northwest.
