### Some State Parks To Close Nov. 1

Overnight campgrounds in most of Oregon's State Parks will close for the 1970 season on Sunday, November 1, after another successful season which witnessed the institution of a reservation system in some parks and a Campsite Information Service. It was announced today by R. L. Porter, state highway engineer.

Facilities at Detroit Lake State Park will remain open until November 30. The camping season usually extends from May through October, but weather is often accountable for a variation in the closing dates, especially in the high altitudes of Central and Eastern Oregon where cold weather could make an earlier closing date necessary.

This year, seven overnight camps will remain open throughout the year. Of these, six are located on the Oregon Coast and the other is located in southwestern Oregon, approximately 12 miles south of Grants Pass between Interstate 5 and the scenic Rogue River. These parks are Fort Stevens, Cape Lookout, Beverly Beach, Jessie M. Honneyman, Bullards Beach, Harris Beach, and Valley of the Rogue.

Generally the State Parks are never closed to the public for day use; however, in high altitudes snow and freezing weather may close access to some areas or require draining water systems and closing rest rooms. In the valley, coastal, and low-altitude areas, this disruption of service may be for only short periods of time.

### LETTERS TO THE EDITOR

#### ADD LETTER TO ED.

The following letter has been received from the Marion Co. Department of Health.

Subject: Vapona Pesticide strips prohibited:

We received a memo from the U. S. Public Health Service, dated April 28, 1970, regarding the Vapona Pesticide Strips. These devices were covered in an earlier memo dated February 1, 1968, relating to automatic or continuous dispensing of insecticides in food establishments and milk houses. The most recent memo states that the Vapona Strips are not to be used in kitchens, restaurants, where food is prepared or served.

You will note the warning on the Vapona Strip label—Do not contaminate food or water. Recent data shows that under favorable conditions residues of DDVP in exposed prepared foods will range up to 0.5 ppm. Under the provisions of the April, 1970, U. S. Public Health Service memo, no automatic or continuous dispensing devices are to be used in food establishments and milk houses nor are the DDVP (Vapona Pesticide Strips) to be used.

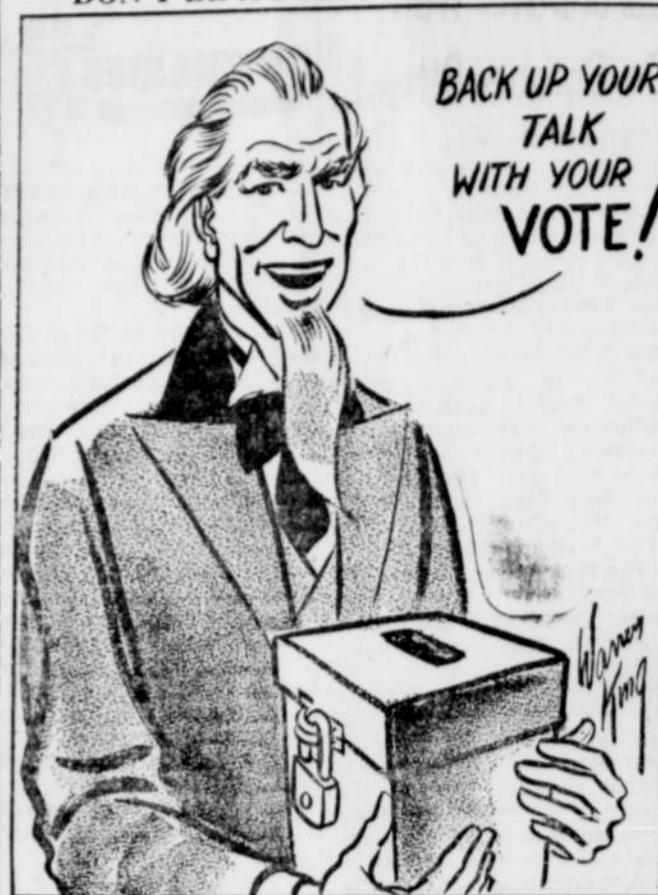
When driving on expressways, watch for signs so you can get in the proper exit lane in advance. If you miss your exit, don't stop, or slow down; go on to the next exit. Decrease speed rapidly once you are in the deceleration lane, but not when leaving the expressway.
