## Fewer Forest Acres Burned This Year

Forest fire losses on private, are as follows: Senior, Frances 1970 season in Oregon have been held to fewer acres burned in spite of a considerable increase in both man-caused and lightning fires, according to Irvin Luiten, president of the Keep Oregon Green Association.

Efficient prevention, detection and suppression by forest landowners, the eight private forest protective associations, federal and state forest agencies were responsible for this, along with newspapers, radio and TV stations that kept the citizens alert to fire weather conditions.

There were 1,804 man-caused fires, 1,993 lightning fires for a total of 3,797 fires which burned over 11,524 acres.

The man-caused fires were the most Oregon has experienced since 1941 when Oregon's Keep Oregon Green program was started.
