**COLLEGE FROSH CAN'T IDENTIFY CONGRESSMEN**

If freshman social studies students at one Portland area Community College are typical, it's little wonder so few 18 to 20-year-olds are taking advantage of the opportunity to become registered voters.

Voter registration for the younger-than-21 age group has been available nationally since November 9. Oregon election officials signed up fewer than 3,000 in the first two weeks.

Some of the apathy on the part of the age group that must include many so-called "student activists" could be attributed to the fact the new voter registration plan enacted by Congress is "under a cloud."

The younger-than-21 vote is prohibited by many state constitutions and currently is being contested by Oregon and at least one other state.

Nevertheless, the lack of response causes many people close to the governmental-political scene to wonder if young people really are "ready" to vote. One such individual, a person who lobbies Oregon's Legislature, decided to find out for himself. Invited to speak before a class of Community College freshmen studying state and national government, he conducted a brief "quiz" prior to his talk.

One question asked: "List the names of the Oregon Congressional delegation (two Senators and four Representatives)."

Fourteen of some 20-odd students bothered to turn in the papers. Not one correctly identified all six. One did correctly identify five and another identified four. Six students included the names of both Senators Mark Hatfield and Bob Packwood. But seven respondents wrote names of only one or two persons.

Some of the names the students listed as U. S. Senators or Representatives were quite interesting. One, for instance, listed a person named "Grossman."

State Sen. Betty Roberts was elevated to Congress, along with someone named "Smith." Former State Rep. Robert Dugdale, unsuccessful candidate to unseat Congresswoman Edith Green in the Nov. 3 General Election, got one student "vote."

gested the test results, coupled with dwindling campus activity generally (even in the environmental field) was an indication students are going "under ground."

Regardless of speculation, the test does point up what should be accepted as a big and worthwhile challenge for both parents and educators. It's obvious upcoming generations won't be interested in government unless they learn something about it before they attain voting age.

Then again, one wonders how the parents and teachers of those college frosh would fare with the same test?

If you're curious, try the question on your family and friends. See for yourself how many can rattle off the names of all six: Senators Hatfield and Packwood and Reps. Green, Wyatt, Dellenback and Ullman.
