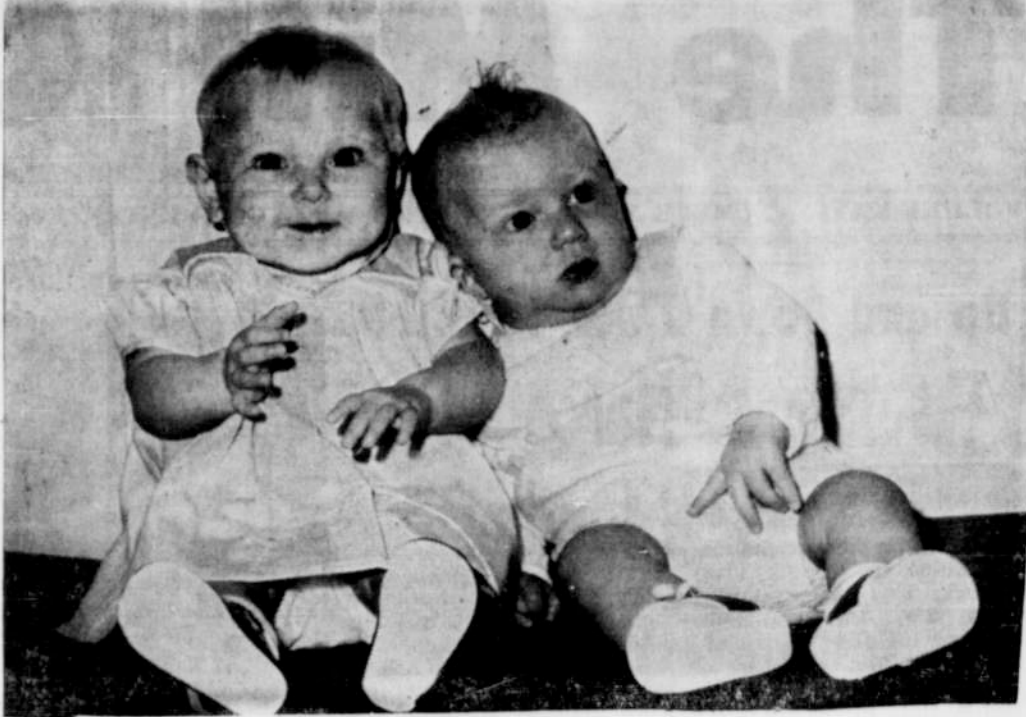
In attendance were friends of the Marion Forks area and office personnel from the Portland office of Fish Hatcheries.
