Summer Home Fees Revised

A new schedule of fees for private use of summer home lots on National Forest land in Oregon and Washington has been announced.

The new annual fees, to begin January 1, 1972, will vary from \$30 for the least valuable lots, to \$375 for high-value lots at the most popular recreation areas.

Fees will increase for 85 percent of the lots, while 15 percent will remain unchanged or will be lowered.

The fees are for exclusive use of a lot for construction of a summer home. The amount is established at 5 percent of market value of the lots as determined by appraisers, and revisions are made at 5-year intervals. To determine current values, the Forest Service contracted for the services of private professional appraisers and also employed its own appraisers to study market values. Appraisers found that \$4,000 lot values are not uncommon, with some ranging as high as \$10,000.
