At the close of the performance, refreshments of punch, solo for the Sunday morning in Fellowship Hall to those attending.

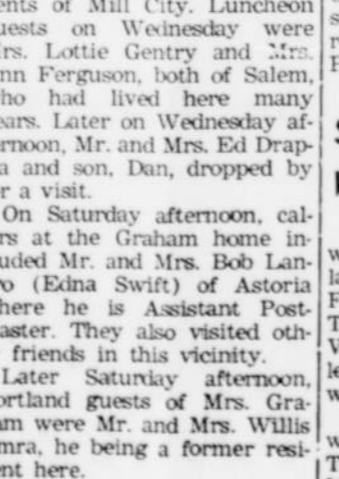
Mrs. Graham Hosts Old Time Guests
