82 Degrees High For Month of May

DETROIT — Weather readings for the month of May, 1971 are as follows. High temperature for the month was 82 degrees on May 5th, against 86 degrees on May 28th in 1970. The low was 34 degrees on the 17th against 30 degrees on May 10th 1970. Total precipitation for the month 3.39 inches with the greatest fall being .99 inches on the 16th. Total precipitation in 1970 during the month was 2.09 inches. The total precipitation (melted snow and rain) for the year to date, is 52.19 inches. Since the above precipitation report was written another .50 inches of rain has fallen in a 24 hour period ending at 8:00 A. M. June 1st.

Average mean is 55 degrees against 56 degrees in 1970. On the 13th, 15th and 17th of the month there were light flurries of snow during the nights and early mornings, none of which, however remained on the ground in a measurable amount.

There were gusty winds prevailing on the 7th, which tore some 600 square feet of roofing from the elementary gym. Also, wind on the 13th, 15th, 20th, and the night of the 30th, which did no appreciable damage, other than to strew lawns with broken branches from trees. Low clouds and mists covered the mountain tops on most of the mornings but we had a good many sunny days to offset the gloom of early mornings. Lilaacs, dogwoods, azaleas, and a few rhododendrons, however are assuring us the worst is over. Parks and camps especially over the weekends, are filling with vacationers and enthusiastic anglers and, at present, all is well.
