# Snow and Ice Still Tough on Lake Fishing

DETROIT — Following one of the heaviest snow packs on record in the Central Oregon region, the recent opening of the High Lake trout season was a pretty restricted affair.

According to a report the ice went off Diamond Lake on Monday of last week. Since then, fishing has been reported good. However, there is still no access into the campgrounds by the lake. According to a report last mid-week the nearest open available camping area was at Lemolo reservoir some 17 miles north of Diamond Lake.

Ice is now off Pauline Lake and the county has plowed out the Little Crater campground. Because of the congested and restricted access the U. S. Forest Service is discouraging anyone from pulling a trailer house up the hill to the lake.

A report indicated that most of the ice should be off East Lake by the Memorial Day weekend. However, the camping situation was not too promising. The road is open on Century Drive as far North as Elk Lake but the lake is reported to be completely frozen over as of the Memorial Day weekend. The report said, there is no access.

Hosmer Lake which is noted for its Atlantic salmon is also frozen over and inaccessible. The report indicated that all of the rafters in Elk Lake Lodge were damaged by the load of heavy snow, and that it may be the end for the Lodge.

Down on the south end of Century Drive there is access to Big Lava Lake, plus available camping area.

According to a report dead Kokanee can be seen at Suttle Lake floating on the water and lying in shallows. The report said lab tests revealed the fish are dying from bacteria called cold water disease. According to the report, the disease does not affect the condition or eating quality of the fish.

Access to high lakes in the middle Willamette district was restricted over the Memorial Day weekend. Marion Lake is still covered and may not thaw for a week or two yet. Ann Lake was free of ice over the weekend. Lost Lake was open, but campgrounds were still snowbound. All reservoirs have been slow with the impoundment of snow runoff.

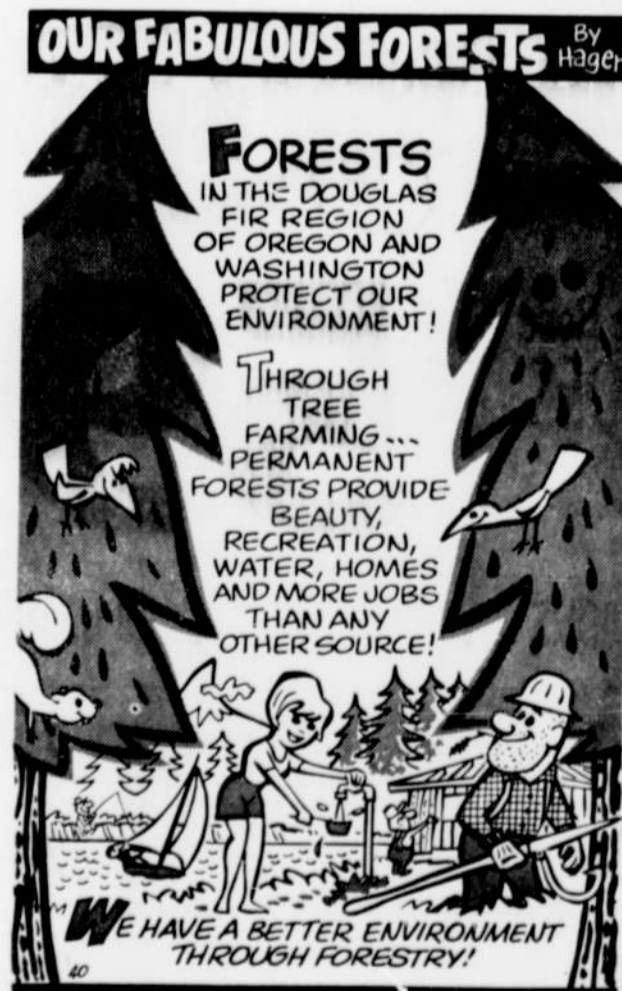
