Report to the People from Santiam Memorial Hospital

Medicine has a distinguished past that goes back to the beginning of recorded history, and the great figures have illuminated the field of medicine at successive stages of its development.

Physicians of the Hippocratic era, some 2,000 years ago, were limited by methods available to observe disease and chart its course, but they were, nevertheless very conscientious and attentive to the patient's need for reassurance and understanding. The writer would make a great leap over the centuries, and consider briefly your modern-day physician's relationship to you, to the hospital and to the community. Technical advances of the last 100 years gives this present generation of physicians incomparably more capacity to preserve health and control disease than was possessed by any of their predecessors. Because of this their responsibilities are correspondingly greater.

The classical picture of your family physician, is, first of all, that he is a citizen of your community and a many-faceted man. He treats you not merely as a disease or case, but as a whole person. He is as much interested in your home, work and neighborhood activities as he is in the illness of the moment.

As a member of the medical staff of your hospital, your care is your doctors concern. He gives the order for your admission when you need the services which only the hospital can provide. He writes the orders for all tests, treatments and medications required for your illness. When you have recovered, his approval for your discharge is given. His membership on the medical staff means more than responsibility for your care as a patient. It means that your doctor is part of a self-governing group responsible for seeing that high quality medical care is given to all patients in the hospital. This responsibility is delegated to the medical staff by the hospital board of directors, which appoints the members of the medical staff each year.

The doctors are responsible to their fellow practitioners and to the board for the medical care of the patient.

Your physician has other duties as well. He makes a complete record of your history and physical examination, as well as written records of all operations, procedures and progress notations. There are many other records which require his approval and signature as well.

He is a member of many committees which work closely with every hospital department and the administration for better patient care. As a member of the hospital staff he attends formal meetings which are an important part of his continuing education. Today, as a member of the medical staff he keeps pace with the rapid expansion of medical knowledge by personal study and by attendance at refresher courses and scientific assemblies.

There are studies which re-

veal that your well-trained family physician, with adequate hospital, laboratory, and consultation services, can and does care for approximately 85-90% of all conditions in their communities. Your doctor is working 60 to 80 hours a week, and not until he reaches the age of 65 does his work fall below the accepted normal of 40 hours. Those extra hours are inevitably subtracted from his leisure, hobbies, sleep and his enjoyment of his family.

The practice of medicine is not a life of undue sacrifice, nor is it one of high income for a short working week, it is a life of devotion to sick people and their families, and of responsibility to the individual, the community, the hospital and the profession.
