Detroit Couple Hurt In Car-Truck Crash

DETROIT—A Detroit couple was injured Sunday afternoon when their car collided with a State Highway Department snow plow truck on slick highway 22 about 400 feet west of the Brentenbush bridge.

Wayne R. Hill, 25, and his wife, Katherine, 19, were taken to Santiam Memorial Hospital at Stayton by Idanha Rural Fire District ambulance, for treatment following the 4:40 p. m. accident. Both sustained laceration and abrasions and Mrs. Hill suffered a broken nose, officials said. Others in the vehicle were their baby, who reportedly was not injured, and an unidentified friend who was visiting here from California. He sustained lacerations and abrasions, also a report said.

The driver of the snowplow, Paul E. VanFleet, 33, also of Detroit, was uninjured, officers said. Hill was driver of the car, which was heavily damaged.

It had been snowing heavily most of the day Sunday, and ambulance drivers said the highway was slick.
