Appointed Extension
Agent for Marion Co.**

The new Marion County Home Economist was appointed to the Polk County staff after graduating from OSU with a degree in home economics education.

In her previous position, Mrs. Christensen worked with low income families, concentrating particularly on home management and nutrition, in an effort supported by the Mid-Willamette Community Action Program.

A replacement for Mrs. Christensen on the Polk County Extension Staff will be named in the near future.

Mrs. Christensen is a native Oregonian, born in Lane County and raised in Lane and Marion Counties. After graduating from the old Mill City High School, she attended OSU before joining the Navy during World War II. She returned to OSU to complete her education after the death of her husband.

Mrs. Dean Mowery of Mill City left last week to attend the General Federation of Women's Club and Shell Oil Company Environmental Conservation Program at the Marriott Motor Hotel in St. Louis.

Mrs. Mowery is State Conservation Chairman in the Oregon Federation Women's Club. Also attending the conference is the State President, Mrs. Richard L. Schaefer of Lebanon.

On the local level, Mrs. Mowery is the Area Beautification chairman, and several beautification awards have been won under her chairmanship. She has been instrumental in planning the new City Park and is among those who have worked tirelessly on this project. Mrs. Mowery will speak at the three-day conference which began Monday, July 17.

More than 100 Women's club members are present at St. Louis to acquaint themselves with environmental problems, and for discussion with industry, government and conservation experts.

Keynote speaker for the meeting will be Senator Jennings Randolph of West Virginia, chairman of the Senate Public Works committee.

Those attending include the state federation conservation chairman and another state officer from the 50 states and the District of Columbia. Mrs. Kermit V. Haugan, GFWC president, explained that on their return home the state officers will provide guidance for local clubs in undertaking projects to help improve and protect the quality of the nation's environment.

This is the second year of the GFWC/Shell program in which clubs judged to have conducted the most effective projects receive state and national awards from Shell totaling \$55,000 a year. All awards money must be used to further the clubs' environmental projects.

Presiding at the conference is Mrs. James A. Scarbro of Ripley, W. Va., GFWC conservation department chairman. Field activities will include a trip to Shell's Wood River, Ill. refinery and a tour of the auto emissions studies being conducted at the company's MTM Product Research and Development Laboratory, also located at Wood River.
