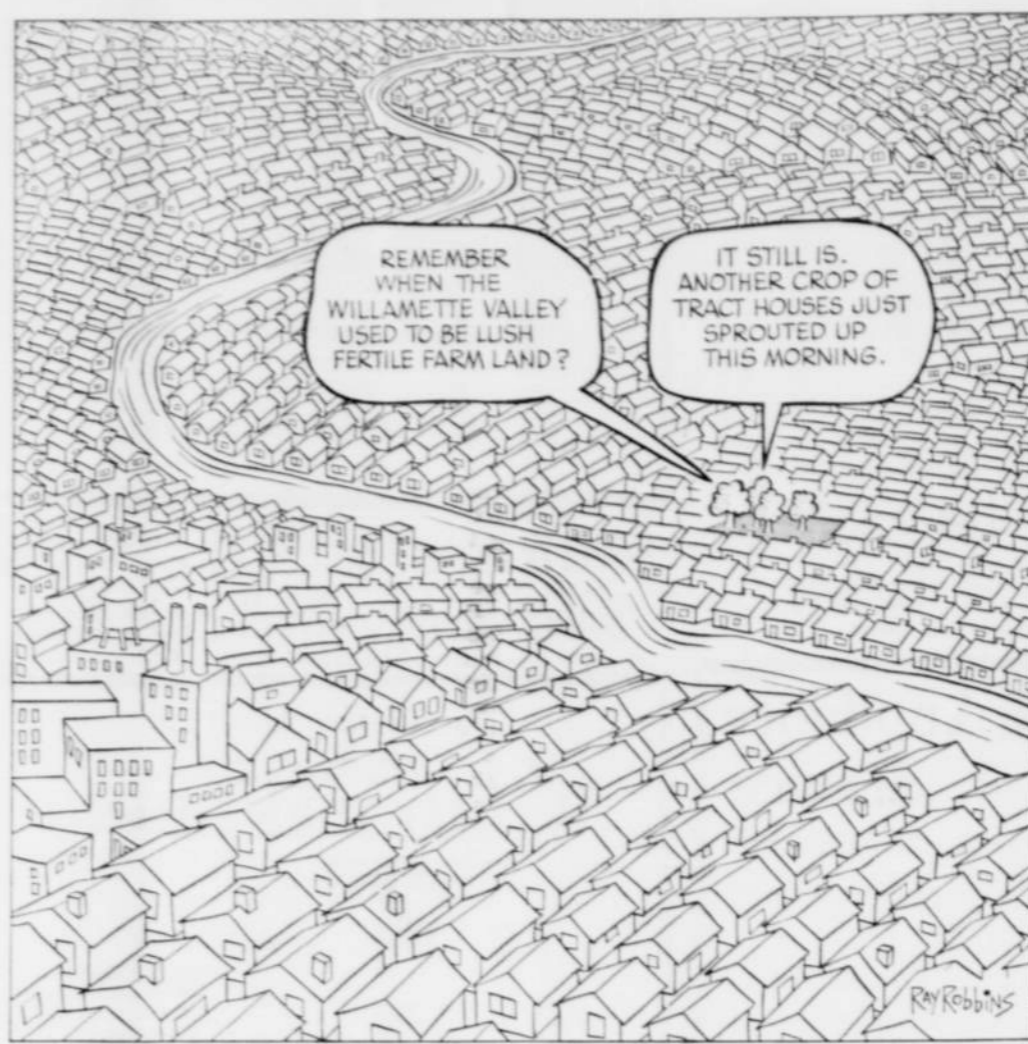

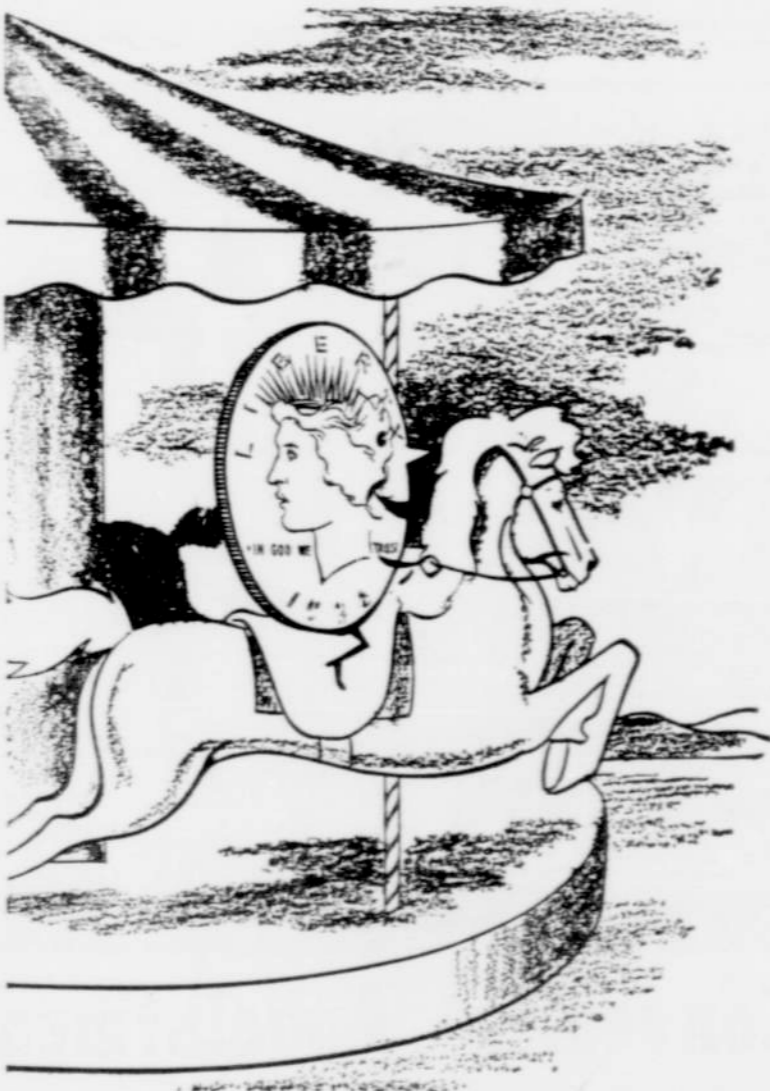

Public Notice

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO CONSTRUCT AND IMPROVE A SEWER SYSTEM AND TO INSTALL A SEWAGE SEPTIC TANK AND DRAIN FIELD

NOTICE HEREBY IS GIVEN that, because of an existing emergency, the Council of the City of Mill City, Oregon, deems it necessary and expedient, and hereby declares its purpose and intention, to construct and improve a sewer system in the Lark Addition to the City of Mill City, and to install a sewage septic tank and drain field adjacent thereto, in accordance with the plans, specifications, and cost estimates for such sewer system and such tank and drain field which were adopted by the Council at its regular meeting of July 12, 1972, which are now on file in the office of the City Recorder of such city, and which, by this reference, are made a part of this Notice.

The Council hereby declares that it is its purpose and intention to construct and improve such sewer system and to install such sewage septic tank and drain field at the expense and cost of the property owner of the property, and that it will levy equal dollar assessments against such properties to meet such expense and cost. The Council has determined that there are 21 of such properties that will be so benefitted, and that the total cost of the improvement, including attorneys' and engineering fees and miscellaneous charges, will be approximately \$13,500.00.

The boundaries of the area and the names of the record owners of properties therein that the Council deems will be specially benefitted by the aforesaid improvements, with descriptions of such properties, are as follows:
