**Camp Fire Sets Fire in Forest**

DETROIT—Fire Dispatcher Dick Gassner, Detroit Ranger Station, said another man-caused fire was spotted Saturday by helicopter patrol at Wigdon Lake, on the wilderness boundary, south of Camp Pioneer. He said the fire which was at the lake was caused by an escaped campfire and that it burned 3 of an acre. A four-man Forest Service crew was sent to the scene.

Another fire was reported about 1:30 p. m. Saturday at Mary's Creek intersection East of Idanha about a half a mile beyond the 57-mile post. Gassner said the fire burning back of a power pole (underground cable) burned about 7 hundredths of an acre. He said cause of the fire is under investigation. Both the Forest Service and the Idanha Rural Fire Protection District answered the alarm.

People traveling the highways are asked to be extra careful during this dry spell. Campfires are not allowed in National Forests other than at designated places.

Detroit District has been lucky so far, with no major fires, although all of the man-caused fires could have been serious if it had not been for quick action of the forest guardians, the Forest Service.
