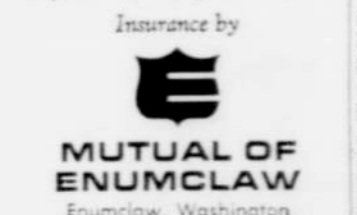
Hostesses were Mrs. Verne Shaw, Mrs. Andrews and Mrs. Bilyeu.
