Pharmacy Topics

Scientists at the Stanford Research Institute have hit on an antifertility pill for males. It works fine—at least with mice. The chemical compound makes male animals infertile for several weeks but seems to leave them unchanged in other ways except for an occasional slight weight loss. Humans will have to wait awhile, though; just to clear the compound for use in control of animal populations will take about two more years.

The FDA, supported by the American Bakers Association and the Millers National Federation, is considering a new regulation that could triple the amount of iron presently being added to enriched bread and flour. The intent is to combat a claimed widespread iron deficiency anemia in the U.S., but the FDA first has to weigh the risks: Excess iron in the system is deposited in vulnerable organs such as the liver, pancreas, and heart.

The folks who argue that alcohol isn't as deadly a drug as marijuana—or, for that matter, hard drugs—haven't been looking at the statistics. According to toxicologist Arthur McBay of the University of North Carolina, there have been no deaths in his state for the past three years from mesalline, marijuana, or amphetamine abuse. But drinking? That's something else again: In just two years, 188 North Carolinians have died from acute alcohol poisoning, drinking themselves to death in one sitting.

The people in India who study suicide statistics have concluded that mother-in-law trouble can be really serious: They blame it for 3,325 of India's 43,633 suicides in 1969.
