INCREASED FLU PREDICTED FOR U. S. AS NEW VIRUS HITS

Epidemiologists are predicting increased flu this winter, thanks to a new strain of influenza virus, against which there is no effective vaccine as yet. The new virus, called A-England-42-72, is a mutant of the Hong Kong Type A virus, which first appeared in 1968. Its effects are similar: a bad case can knock a person out for three days. According to officials of the Center for Disease Control in Atlanta, the present flu vaccine, based on the Hong Kong strain will be minimally effective against the new variety, and a new vaccine won't be ready until after this winter's flu season peaks in December and January.
