Pinocle Party At Eagles Lodge Hall

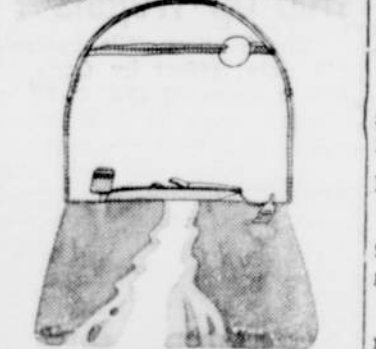
Four tables of cards were in play last Thursday at the weekly pinocle party at the Eagles Lodge.
