The sale, located approxi- Detroit. mately 12 miles S. E. of Detroit involves 6,800 MFB of Douglas Fir which sold for \$186.00 per thousand, \$98.56 above the advertised rate of \$87.44 per thousand.

The 3,900 MBF of Western species advertised at \$58.40 per thousand sold for \$144.00 per M in the final bidding, \$55.60 above the advertised rate. Included in the sale were 273 acres of all species logs which sold at the advertised rate of \$117.88 per acre.




