**Freres Veneer Bid Winner**

Freres Veneer, Lyons, was the apparent successful bidder at \$1,709,400.00 for an estimated 10,700,000 board feet of Willamette National Forest timber, in the Bugaboo Leave Timber Sale, conducted at Detroit Ranger Station Monday morning.

The sale, located approximately 12 miles S. E. of Detroit involves 6,800 MFB of Douglas Fir which sold for \$186.00 per thousand, \$98.56 above the advertised rate of \$87.44 per thousand.

The 3,900 MBF of Western Hemlock and other coniferous species advertised at \$58.40 per thousand sold for \$144.00 per M in the final bidding, \$85.60 above the advertised rate. Included in the sale were 273 acres of all species logs which sold at the advertised rate of \$117.88 per acre.

There were five qualified oral bidders.

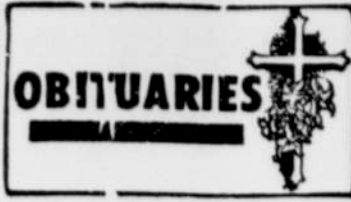
**Past Residents To**

DETROIT — Canyon friends were saddened to learn of the death of Henry (Hank) Kniss, 63, late resident of Oreville, Wash. and former resident of Detroit.

He died at his home early Saturday morning apparently of a heart attack.

Following twenty years and nineteen days of military service, he worked at a Long Beach, Calif. post office from September through November of 1962.

Coming here in April of 1963, he was employed by the U. S. Forest Service, Detroit Ranger Station. Following promotions during his employment here he was serving as business management assistant at the time of his transfer in 1968 to Tonasket Ranger District, Okanogan National Forest. He was serving in this same capacity with a promoted rating at the time of his death. He had planned to retire May 11, 1973.

An active member in the American Legion Idanha Post 141, he served both as vice commander and adjutant during his residency here.

Services were held at 2:00 p.m., Wednesday, April 18, at Barnes Funeral Home, Oreville, Wash.

Survivors include the widow, Jenny, his father, a sister and step-daughter (names not known) all of Eugene.

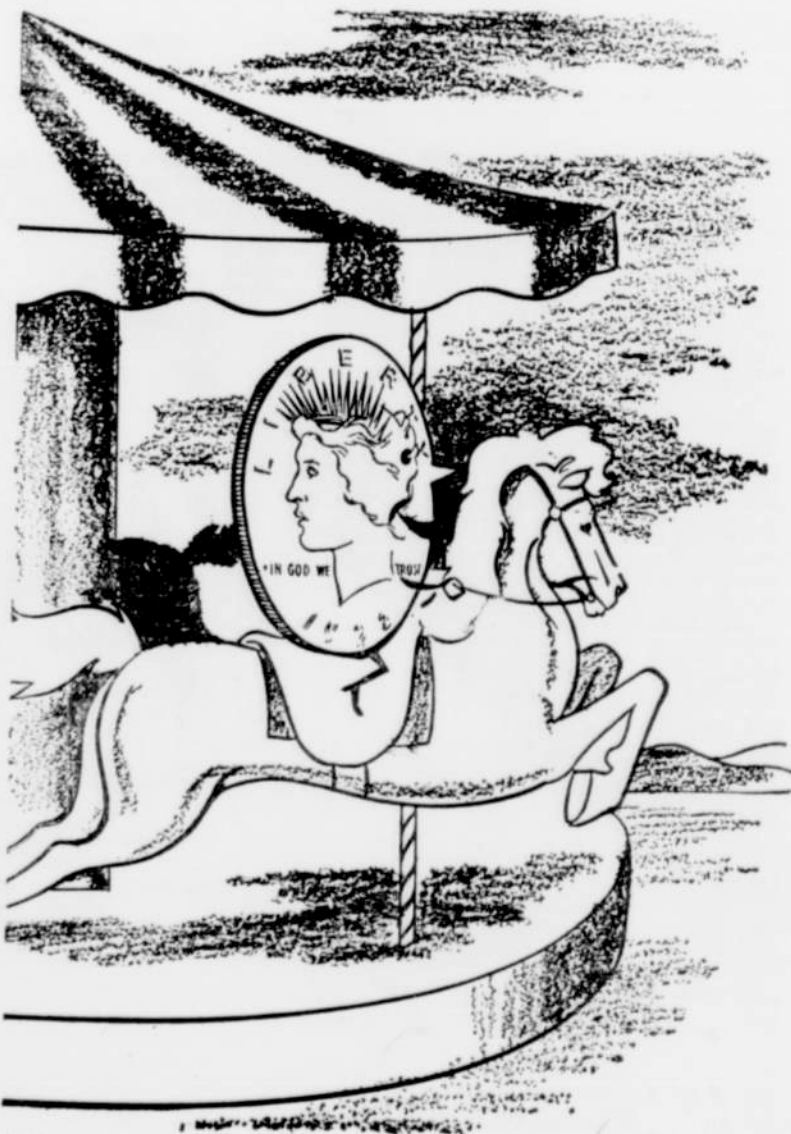
