\*A new U. S. Public Health Service report adds another link in the growing chain of evidence showing "a strong, probably causal association between cigarette smoking and higher late fetal and infant mortality among smok-ers' infants." The PHS claims that about 4,600 stillbirths a year in this country can probably be blamed on smoking habits of the women involved. That figure is roughly equivalent to twothirds of all the deaths from accidents to Americans aged 1 to 14; and accidents are the leading cause of death in this age group.

\*About 3,256,000 babies were born last year, a surprising 9% decrease since 1971.

\*Research is being conducted to explain why enthusiastic cereal eaters have the world's lowest stomach cancer rate. Preliminary studies show that cereals are rich in vitamin E and selonium, which appear to prevent gastric cancer in mice.
