

This budget was prepared and presented to the counci as a good budget for the City of Mill City and this is what you will be voting on, not the additional revenue that th council felt they should add to it at a later meeting.

It is true the budget being presented to the residents of Mill City is lower, millagewise. It has been reduced almost a dollar per thousand true cash value on your home. But the budget is up \$61,913.50 over last year (figures taken from published budget of May 26, 1973).


