Bighorn Sheep, Early Deer Applications Due
Sportsmen are reminded that they have about a month remaining in which to apply for bighorn sheep and August deer season permits. These applications must be received at the game commission office in Portland by 5:00 p.m., July 17, to be eligible for the drawing scheduled at 10:00 a.m. on July 27.

Applications for sheep tags must be made on the "Controlled Hunt Application Card", which is available at all license agencies. Ten sheep permits will be issued this year in the Steens Mountain and Owyhee units. Hunters who wish to participate in the Jackson or Josephine Agricultural Area hunts should apply on the application issued with the general deer tag.
