- 1/2 cup medium green pepper, finely minced
- 1/2 cup finely minced celery
- 1/2 cup chicken bouillon
- 3 ounces drained, dried soybeans, drained
- 2 tablespoons dehydrated onion flakes
- 1 slice 100% whole wheat bread
- made into crumbs
- 1 egg
- 1/2 cup garlic powder
- 1/2 cup flour
- Salt and pepper to taste
- 1/2 medium green pepper, cut into rings
- 1/2 cup onion, sliced
- 1/2 cup fresh mushrooms

Combine green pepper, celery and bouillon in a saucepan. Simmer until celery is tender. Drain and place in mixing bowl. Add remaining ingredients, except last 3, and mix well. Spoon mixture into a small baking dish and shape into a loaf and bake at 350° F. for about 25 minutes or until firm and golden brown on top. Serve with pepper rings, onion and mushrooms. Makes 1 serving.
