City Council Meeting Minutes

REGULAR MONTHLY COUNCIL MEETING: Sept. 12, 1973.

The regular monthly council meeting was called to order at 8:00 p.m. by Mayor Bate with Councilmen Brunner, Howell and DeMain present. Councilmen Willis and Carey excused.

The minutes of the last regular council meeting of Aug. 8, 1973, the special meeting of Aug. 17, 1973, and the revenue sharing budget meeting of Aug. 27, 1973, were read and approved.

The recorder read the correspondence. The official census count from the center for population research and census at Portland State, for the City of Mill City is now 1525. A letter from the department of commerce, imposing a 1% surcharge on building permit fees was read. A plan to do a classification and pay study for the city from the local government personnel institute was read.

Letters from Standard Oil and Union Oil were read. The city received no bids for gasoline for the coming year. Councilman Howell read the police report: traffic citations, 13; traffic warnings, 18; municipal citations: adult, 0; juvenile, 0; jail record: prisoners lodged, 3; court record: cases processed, 12; incidents received, 46; complaints received, 15; accidents received, 0; money received (fines) \$565.

Kitty Horton of the human resources Mid-Willamette Valley Referral Center explained some of the workings of the local referral center, which will be opening at the state police building on Highway 22. It has been housed at Gates City Hall. She asked for council approval and support. Mrs. Kyte of the Stayton center was introduced. Moved by Howell, seconded by Brunner to give Mrs. Horton a letter of support from the council. Passed with all aye votes.

Moved by Brunner, seconded by DeMain to pay the bills as read in the amount of \$9,015.84. Passed with a roll call with all aye votes. Councilman Brunner read the bids for the paving of S. E. Myrtle St. from N. Santiam Paving \$1,915 and D&D Paving \$2,268. Moved by Brunner, seconded by Howell to notify Santiam Paving to do the work. Passed with all aye votes.

Councilman Brunner explained the problem the street department is having with the durability of wooden sign posts. In the future, when a replacement is needed, the city will use iron posts.

Councilman Brunner read resolution #113, creating a circle sewer district. Moved by Howell, seconded by DeMain that Resolution #113 be adopted by council as read. Passed with all aye votes. Councilman Howell suggested adoption of Blue Cross

Plan IV Health Insurance to replace Plan II, now used by the city for employees. Plan IV gives the employees better coverage. Moved by DeMain, seconded by Brunner to adopt Plan IV of Blue Cross Health Insurance. Passed with all aye votes.

Councilman DeMain read a letter from Eldon N. Hutchinson, fire chief and Clyde E. Golden, drill master, requesting condemnation of buildings on the property at 233 S. E. Hazel and outlining the reasons for the request. After discussion, it was moved by DeMain, seconded by Howell that the council take action to condemn the buildings at 233 S. E. Hazel. Passed with all aye.

Councilman Howell and DeMain discussed the unsafe conditions of property and house at 289 N. E. Alder. Councilman DeMain will ask the fire marshal to inspect and make a report on the conditions.

Councilman Howell read police chief Gillenwater's letter recommending Arthur W. Sprague for the position of fourth policeman, to be funded by revenue sharing. Councilman Howell endorsed the recommendation with the understanding that the position will be for a period of one year. The salary will be \$500 for the first six months, and \$550 per month, with council approval for the last six months, in accordance with the budget committee and council guidelines. With adoption of the supplemental revenue sharing budget, the position will be open on Oct. 1, 1973. Moved by DeMain, seconded by Brunner to hire Arthur W. Sprague for a period of one year effective Oct. 1, 1973. Passed with all aye votes.

Councilman Howell read a proposed service contract for police radios from Industrial Radiotronics. On the suggestion of George Long, the council decided to investigate the possible use of local service men before adopting the contract. Meeting adjourned: 9:05 p.m.
