"YOUR LAND AND MY LAND"

Frances (Fanny) Crosby
She could never remember having seen a single object — blind since she was six weeks old.

But her radiant spirit poured out poetry. Many of her verses are well known and her hymns are among the most beloved.

"Blessed Assurance, Jesus is mine"

"All the way My Savior Leads Me"

"Rescue the Perishing"

"Safe in the Arms of Jesus"

"Saved by Grace"

"Pass Me Not O Gentle Savior"

Jesus Keep Me Near the Cross

"Tell Me the Story of Jesus"

These are a few of the hundreds she wrote.

Homer Rodeheaver, that great gospel singer, tells an interesting story of the last one. During WWI, he sang this song to groups of soldiers in France—in shell-torn barracks, in dug-outs, to marching lines going to the front and once in the Argonne forest just as a big drive started. "No matter where I sang this song, the boys would take off their dirty service caps or hang their trench helmets on their arms and remain perfectly quiet. Many men I have met since the war, referred to the unusual situations in which it was sung and the impression the song made upon them at the time," (probably it was just what they needed).

Her hymns came easily and rapidly and it wasn't long until Fanny Crosby was being hailed as the most popular writer of gospel songs in America.

"Saved by Grace" was nearly lost. She wrote it for a friend and he tucked it away in his desk and forgot it. She was asked to speak at a Methodist Conference. She spoke beautifully and finished with the words of "Saved by Grace". From that moment it gained momentum.

Dwight L. Moody claimed she had "Song-wings".

"Here is a tune I have written", said her friend Mrs. Knapp. "What does it say to you?" she played it over several times. Suddenly Fanny's face lit up. "Why that music says, 'Blessed Assurance, Jesus is Mine'."

She never permitted anyone to express sympathy for her blindness. When she was eight years old she wrote:

"Oh, what a happy soul am I Although I cannot see, I am resolved That in this world contented I will be.

To weep and sigh because I'm blind I cannot, and I won't."

Echoed in many of her songs are the Bible verses she learned as a child.

For many years she was an instructor in the New York Institute For the Blind. There she married Alexander Van Alstyne, a blind teacher of music.

Look for her name in the upper left hand corner of the page in your hymn book.

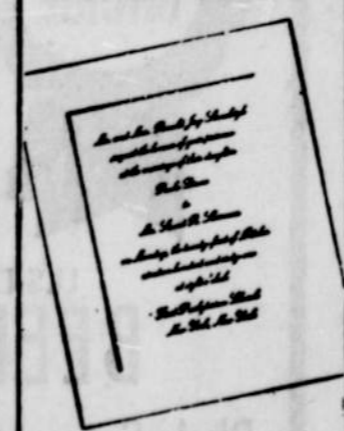
