Santiam JVs Slash Detroit JVs 70-39

The Santiam JVs jumped out to a 15-6 first quarter lead and went on to defeat the Detroit JV's 70-39 in a non-league game at Detroit, Tuesday.

The Wolverines began slowly and could hit only 34% of the field goal attempts in the first half, while Detroit hit 46% of their attempts; however, Santiam led 31-24 at half time.

Santiam outscored Detroit 16-4 in the third quarter. Detroit could manage only two field goals in nine attempts. Santiam's substitutes played most of the fourth quarter and outscored the Detroit Cougars 23-11.

The Wolverines completely dominated the boards, outrebounding the Cougars 45-17 and holding Detroit to only two offensive rebounds. Santiam also played a very

aggressive defense, forcing Detroit to turn over the ball 24 times. Santiam had only 13 turnovers.

The leading scorer for Santiam was Bill Gabriel, who netted fifteen points. Also scoring in double figures for Santiam was Maurie Richards with 12 points.

David Etzel and Rick Lady controlled the boards for Santiam, pulling down 13 and nine respectively.
