## Rams Fail To Hold Down Wolverines

The Santiam Wolverines outscored the Regis Rams, 22-19 in the fourth quarter to nip the Rams 58-54 in a league game at Regis Tuesday.

The Rams got off to a fast start and led 10-3 early in the first quarter. Santiam then made a strong comeback and trailed by only four points, 15-11, at the end of the first quarter. Santiam completely dominated the second quarter, outscoring Regis 10-4, for a 21-19 half time lead. Regis outscored Santiam by one point in the third quarter to cut Santiam's lead to one point. The final quarter saw the lead change hands many times with neither team able to take control of the game. Santiam finally took control when, with the score knotted 50-50, the Wolverines scored six straight points to lead 56-50 with 1:25 remaining. Regis then scored four points to trail by two. David Plotts connected on two free throws with three seconds remaining to insure the victory for Santiam.

Santiam was led by Gary Demain with 23 points. Demain connected on 11 of his 13 field goal attempts and also pulled down nine rebounds. Also scoring in double figures were Frank Bryant and Roger Davidson led Santiam in rebounds with 13.

Regis outshot Santiam 48%-45% from the field, however Santiam shot six more times than Regis. Santiam held a slight advantage in rebounds, outbounding Regis 32-27.

Santiam's league record is now 8-2, good enough for a first place tie with Regis and Salem Academy.

## THE FAMILY LAWYER

"Activist" Shareholder

Suppose a political activist buys one share of stock in a corporation that makes guns. His purpose is to gain access to a list of shareholders, so he can arouse their opposition to the company's products.  
Would the company have to let him see the books?  
Most courts faced with this question have said no. True, every stockholder is a co-owner of the corporation. However, say these courts, the relationship is strictly economic, not political. To see the books, he must have an economic motive. He must be acting, at least in part, to protect his investment.



The activist shareholder is new but the problem is old: how open should a corporation's books be? Clearly, there has to be some sort of limitation on access. As one judge explained, in barring a stockholder who was "just curious":

"Considering the huge size of many modern corporations and the complicated nature of their bookkeeping, to permit their thousands of stockholders to roam at will through their records would render impossible not only any attempt to keep their records efficiently, but the proper carrying on of their businesses."

On the other hand, a stockholder with a legitimate economic motive generally cannot be prevented from seeing the books merely because the management doesn't happen to like him.

One stockholder was refused access to his company's books because he was considered a "troublemaker". He was indeed a troublemaker. But the trouble he wanted to make was getting rid of the management, which he thought was doing a bad job of running the business.

In these circumstances, a court ordered the company to open the books for his inspection. The court said that for a disgruntled investor, throwing the management out was a natural and proper objective.
