The women were terrified and bowed low before them. Then the men asked, "Why are you looking in a tomb for someone who is alive? He isn't here! He has come back to life again! Don't you remember what he told you back in Galilee - that the Messiah must be betrayed into the power of evil men and be crucified and that he would rise again the third day?" Then they remembered, and rushed back to Jerusalem to tell his eleven disciples - and everyone else - what had happened.


