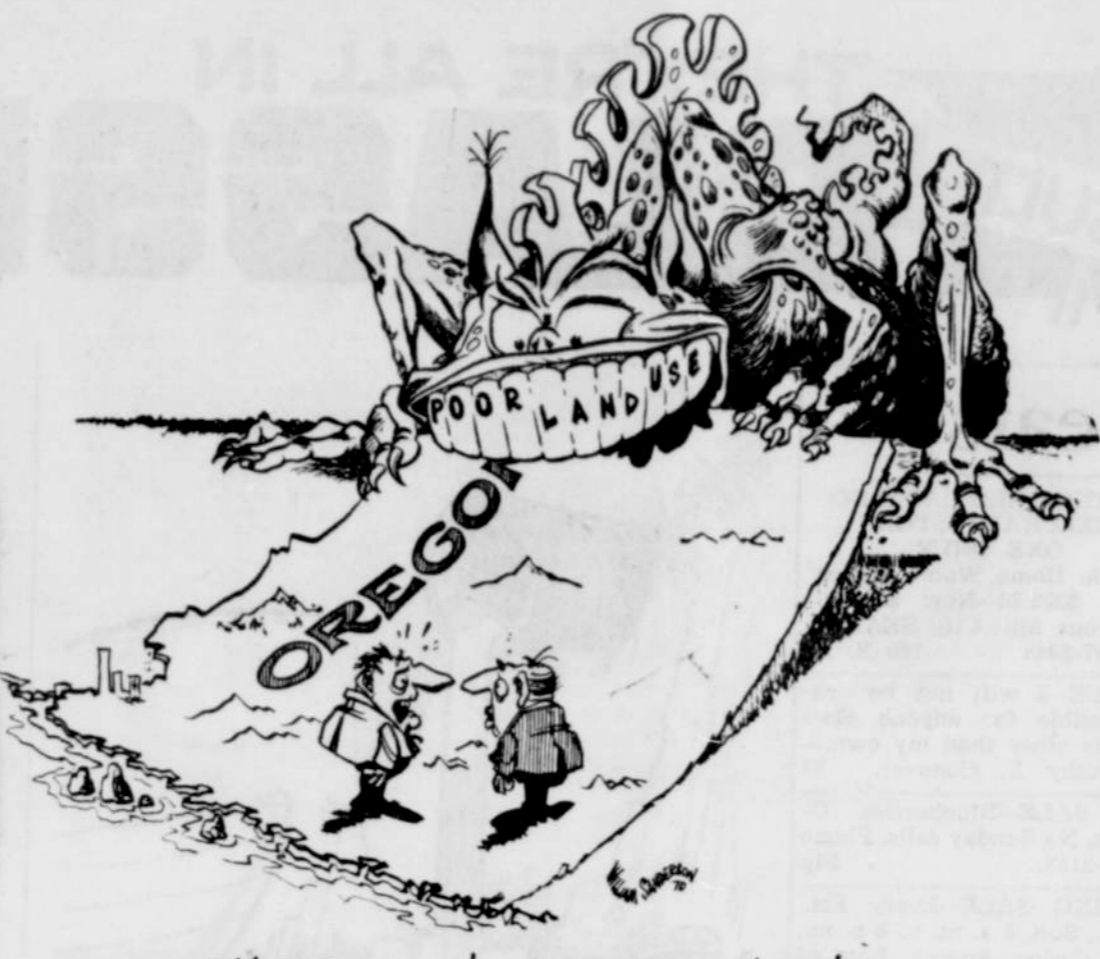

### Forest Service Reminds Owners Of Horses

People who take horses into the Mt. Jefferson, Mt. Washington, Three Sisters and Diamond Peak Wilderness areas on the Willamette and Deschutes National Forests should be aware of special regulations for protecting those areas, R. L. Worstell, Acting Forest Supervisor, said today.

Travelers may not have any pack or saddle animal within 200 feet from the shoreline of any lake within the four Wildernesses except for the purpose of watering, unloading or through travel, he said. Worstell also added that travelers to these four Wildernesses could not participate in organized contests including marathons, horse racing or endurance rides.

All persons entering either the Mt. Jefferson or Three Sisters Wilderness areas overnight must obtain a Wilderness Permit prior to entry. Permits are available at any Ranger Station on the Willamette National Forest as well as the Supervisor's Office in Eugene. Permits are not necessary in either the Mt. Washington or the Diamond Peak Wildernesses.

### Plan May Simplify Qualifying for Food Stamps

DETROIT—According to a report, the Mid-Willamette Valley Action Agency and the State Public Welfare division have developed a limited test system to make it easier for elderly and severely disabled persons to be certified for food stamps.

Under the test program, food stamp certifiers will be in Silverton, Stayton and Detroit on specific days during the next three months to certify persons who face major difficulties in getting to the food stamp centers in Salem and Woodburn.

Certifiers will be at the Silverton Referral Center from 9 to 11:15 a. m. on the second Tuesday during August, September and October. Elderly and disabled persons must call the Referral Center in advance for an appointment and transportation. The Stayton Referral Center will offer similar service on the second Wednesday during the three month period, also between the hours of 9 and 11:15 a. m. Hours the second Wednesday will be 1:30 to 3:30 p. m. at the Detroit Patio cafe.

Applicants are to bring identification, proof of residency, income information and medical, utility and other regular bills. Those found eligible for food stamps will be certified immediately and the stamp cards will be mailed to them the next day. Stamps then can be purchased at any Post Office.

Lyn Horine, a Community Action Agency administrator, expressed hope that the text certification program could be extended. Elderly residents in the upper North Santiam Canyon (residing on the Marion County side) may contact Mrs. Frank Hancock at the Detroit Patio, for further information.
