Pharmacy Topics .

*The status of pH in hair care products has been raised lately. pH is a scale which indicates the acid or base level of a substance. Neutral is 7, therefore, anything above 7 is basic (or alkaline) and anything below 7 is acidic. It has been long known that hair, skin, scalp and nails were the healthiest when the pH was 4.5 to 5.5 (slightly acidic). Even water which is neutral (pH 7) is too alkaline for the hair's delicate pH balance. Most hair preparations, such as color treatments, permanents, straighteners, and some shampoos — particularly soap shampoos — are alkaline. As a result, of continued use the protective cuticle layers of the hair fiber open, and the hair fibers become more porous, and when moisture is applied, the hair swells, feels spongy and becomes generally unmanageable. Too much acid will cause the hair to be easily broken when brushed or combed. At a pH of 4.5 to 5.5, the hair has its greatest elasticity, strength and lustre.
