Critics say such a step likely would produce annual sessions and the next step woud be a continuous session - operating like the U. S. Congress. And costs would zoom upward in a similar manner.

In 1954 Congress employed 4,500 people with a budget of \$42 million. In 1975 congress employed 16,000 individuals and had a budget of \$328 million. That's a boost of 256% in staff and 681% in budget.

Ten years ago the president of the Oregon senate employed two secretaries during the session and an administrative assistant for part of the session. When the session ended, he closed the office.

Today, the offices of leadership of both houses bustle with activity year-round.
