
Reptile Show Held At Detroit

This transmission is the latest technological entry into the burgeoning mass transit industry and represents the first phase of a major expansion effort at the company. Each of the new three-speed automatics goes through a series of static and operational tests by technicians such as Charles L. Acton to verify quality and reliability before shipment to the coach manufacturer. Fluid flowing under pressure through the intricately carved channels of the valve body (in front of Acton) activates a series of valves. These in turn control the automatic-shifting components. Completing the picture are the roller conveyors and perforated walkways covering the pro-
