### Detroit Council Hears Reports

DETROIT — The regular monthly meeting of the Detroit City Council held Tuesday, Dec. 9, was called to order by Mayor Jim King at 7:30 p.m.

Councilmen present were Keith Krammer and Joyce Crist. Councilmen Bob Layman and Vern Collins were absent. There were four citizens present. The minutes of the November meeting were read and a treasurer's and financial report given by city recorder, Ruth Thomasson. The minutes were approved as read.

Ralph Edminster, gave a report on the purchase of five street stop signs. The poles are to be set four feet into the ground with the sign level eight feet above the ground.

Mayor King read a resolution from Marion County in which it stated that Patton St. has been surrendered to the city. A motion was then made, seconded and carried that the resolution be accepted.

King also read a letter from the Bureau of Government and Research Service in regards to updating city ordinances. The service will send the council detailed information and costs to update ordinances plus meeting with the council at least for one meeting. City recorder is to look into this matter.

A motion was made, seconded and carried that the planning commission act as the CCI (Citizens Committee Involvement) to work within the guidelines and procedures of the Detroit Comprehensive Land Use Plan; the need for a plan and the need for citizen participation in that plan.

A motion was made, seconded and carried that \$200 be allowed for the planning commission to use for correspondence and other expenses connected in carrying out the procedures of the Comprehensive Land Use Program.

The following six month plan has been established and requires an extended planning period from January to June 1976:

- 1—draft, proof read, and finalize questionnaires which are mailed to all permanent and temporary residents of Detroit.
- 2—to make arrangements with private and public organizations for speaking engagements.
- 3—to invite special interest groups to attend the meetings and provide input for the comprehensive plan.
- 4—to apply for planning assistance grants with the Marion County Planning Commission.

- February:**
- 1—provide time for input from special interest groups.
  - 2—send reminders to all permanent and temporary residents to return the questionnaire.
  - 3—study, discuss, and compile input from received questionnaires.
- March:**
- Town hall to be open to the public for discussion and publication of questionnaire results.
- April:**
- Inventory of the City of Detroit including number and condition of residences and businesses; location and condition of public utilities, streets, schools, churches, etc.
- May:**
- The CCI will develop basic goals for the City of Detroit's comprehensive plan based on questionnaires, input from town hall meetings, and the town inventory. These goals are to be submitted to the Detroit City Council for ap-
