Mitchell, of Gazelle, Cal.; Judge Smith of Altamont, sold ten head of mules for \$625 to Mr. McHenry of Modesto, Cal. Mr. McHenry also bought about 100 head of mules of John Wells of Bly. He also bought in Sprague river valley 600 head of cattle at 6 and 6½ cents per pound.—Klamath Republican.

A great deal has been said lately regarding a miner's inch and what constitutes a miner's inch of water. It may be of interest to some of our readers who have read the controversy. In measuring a miner's inch of water, the surface of the water is to be exactly six inches above the center of the discharge. If the aperture be two inches in height, each square inch of the opening in the plank (1¼ inches thick) will discharge a miner's inch—equal to .02499 cubic feet per second, 1.4994 cubic feet per minute, 89.964 cubic feet per hour, 2159.146 cubic feet per day of twenty-four hours.
