County Exhibits at the State Fair.

The liberal premiums offered for county exhibits at the Oregon State Fair this year will afford every county in the state an opportunity to exhibit her resources. There is no question about the great number of homeseekers coming to the state this year, and the State Fair will afford them an excellent opportunity to judge for themselves of our resources. For this reason alone every county that makes any pretension to general agriculture should make a good showing. The premiums offered on county exhibits are \$1,000, divided into five parts, as follows: First premium, \$300; second premium, \$250; third premium, \$200; fourth premium, \$150; fifth premium, \$100. The Southern Pacific Company hauls all exhibits to and from the fair free of charge, and a very liberal rate is made on all other lines in the eastern portion of the state.

Easy Money.

The New Era invites the Lakeview base ball team to Alturas to cross bats with the "invincibles" of that place. Arrangements have been made here to offer an inducement for the "invincibles" of Mosoc to come to Lakeview and find a little "easy money" at the tournament during Fourth of July week. Two hundred dollars will be hung up in purses for base ball contests. Besides that there will be four days of good horse racing, for which eleven hundred dollars will be given in purses, for the good horses of Mosoc to try to capture. The Depression Over.

A Boston dispatch of the 9th says that the demand for wool during the week is not equal to that of the past two or three weeks, but the dealers believe that the depression of the past two years has passed and that their goods now have a good sale. The bulk of business has been in territorial grades, fine medium and fine selling at 40 to 45 scoured, while the sample lots call for 44 to 45; offerings were moderate in these woods, with values practically unchanged. New Australian wools are held on the basis of the cost to import.

St. Louis, April 9.—Wool, territorial and western medium, 14 to 16; fine, 11 to 15; coarse, 11 to 14.

After July 1st it will not be necessary to place stamps on bank checks, certificates of deposit, promissory notes, money orders, export bills of lading, express receipts, telegraph and telephone messages, powers of attorney, mortgages, protests, warehouse receipts, proprietary medicines, chewing gum, perfumery and cosmetics.
