#### Chattel Mortgages Must be Recorded.

Chattel mortgages are governed by a new law, passed by the recent session of the legislature. Not only are the fees different from those imposed heretofore, but the manner of keeping record of them also is different. They are now treated in the same manner as real estate mortgages.

The new law provides that no chattel mortgages shall be filed, but that they must be recorded. In order to be in legal form a chattel mortgage must be signed, witnessed and acknowledged the same as real estate mortgage. Recording costs the same as real estate mortgages which is 10 cents a folio 5 cents for each index and 25 cents for a certificate of the recorder.

This arrangement makes more work for the recorder and gives an additional income to the county.

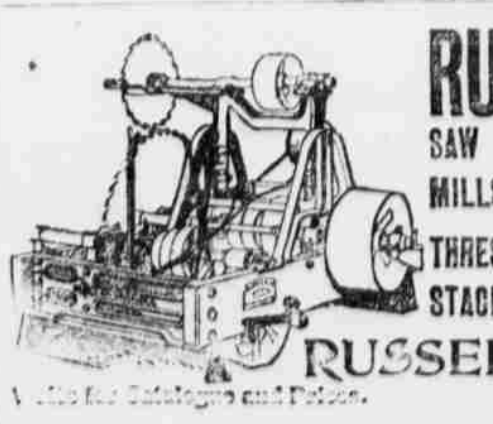
