A Narrow Escape.
Last Sunday morning Hon. A. J. Jackson and wife, of Steel Swamp, were preparing to come to Alturas, says the New Era. Mr. Jackson drove up for Mrs. Jackson to get into the buggy, but his spirited team acted very fractious, so he decided to drive around for a while, to get them quieted down. Instead of becoming pacified, however, the animals became unmanageable and started to run, throwing Mr. Jackson over the dash board to the ground. In some way he was caught under the wheels of the carriage and dragged quite a distance, which bruised him so severely that he was rendered unconscious. When he was picked up and taken to his home it was thought that life was extinct, and consciousness did not return for almost three hours. As soon as he was able to sit up, Mrs. Jackson started with him for Alturas, for medical treatment. Upon arriving here, Dr. Blondin was summoned, who announced that no bones were broken, although the patient was so severely bruised and shaken up that he would not be able to be around for some time.

This was an exceedingly narrow escape from instantaneous death, as the road where the runaway occurred was very rocky, and it is a wonder that Mr. Jackson was not instantly killed when he was dashed to the ground.

Wholesale Arrests.
The United States Grand Jury at Helena, Montana, on June 26th found 102 indictments against fraudulent timber land locators. The indictments are all against land locators in the Missoula land district, and charge perjury in swearing that they filed upon the lands for personal use, whereas they transferred them soon after securing title. The lands comprise about 15,000 acres and were bought by R. M. Cobban. The persons indicted include school teachers, ranchers, servant girls and others.
