Some Experiments.

The people of the West Side including Drews Creek, Cottonwood, Tick Ridge, and that whole section west of Lakeview and Goose Lake, have been trying for years to make a success of raising grain of all kinds and grasses. From the lack of water in places it is claimed, and from the great quantity of jack rabbits in the whole section, the crops are not what might be called a success. Some say if the land was all taken and the sage brush cleared off that there would be no more rabbits, but then that would not make any more water. Now, we do not believe that to be the case altogether; of course to clear off the sage brush the rabbit would have no home, and there is no doubt that some sections need water for irrigating and The Examiner would like nothing better than to see a large irrigation system started over there. But it has been proven that vegetables grow there as good, if not better than any other place in the county, and grain has been produced in places that cannot be beat.

Mr. Robt. Nelson, who is somewhat enthusiastic on seeing the West Side developed, is making some practical experiments in grains and grasses. A few days ago he brought to town a half dozen samples of as many different kinds and we noticed particularly the fine specimen of oats which were about three feet high and well filled. It is expected that they will attain the height of five feet when matured. The oats are growing on ground that has not been irrigated and only one rain has fallen upon them, and it isn't like Kansas either. Among the lot was a specimen of bromus grass which is not so tall as most samples we have seen but it is very thick and heavy, with small stems and lots of seed, which it is said makes better feed than the coarser kind. Mr. Nelson has quarter acre tracts of these half dozen varieties and will practically demonstrate to the farmers of the West Side this fall, what can be done on that sandy sage-brush soil. He is also experimenting in vegetables of different kinds that were thought impossible to grow in this county, for instance, he has peanuts in bloom and has sweet potatoes that look fine, however, the season here may be too short for them.

There is a great future for that vast section on the West Side, and it is not far off.

A number of the supporting cables of the Brooklyn bridge pulled out of their sockets, and were found one day last week dangling in the air. This completely stopped all street car traffic over the structure, and after a delay of two days it was repaired. The accident caused great excitement and the public reserves were called out.

After praying several days for rain in Kansas, the people of Wichita rang bells and blew whistles and serenaded the rain with a brass band. At night cannons were fired and an immense display of fire-works was made. An exchange suggests that no doubt the rain was highly gratified by this reception.
