

## SCHOOL BOOKS SELECTED

Books Will Cost No More Here Than In Portland.

The Board of Education has made its contracts with the successful bidders for the furnishing of school books, and the agents of the school book publishers securing the contracts have placed the general agency for Oregon in the hands of J. K. Gill & Co., of Portland. This firm is now making arrangements with dealers in all the towns designated as depositories by the State Board of Education, and it is expected that long before the schools open for this fall's work, every such town will have at least one dealer with a complete stock of books to sell to the pupils, or to exchange for old books heretofore in use.

The state agents agree to deliver the books, freight prepaid, to every dealer in the state, thus putting the dealer at Lakeview on the same plane as the one in Portland, giving each his books at the same price, and giving to the dealer at Lakeview as great a profit on his sales as the one in the lower Willamette valley.

In the course of a couple of weeks stocks of school books will be on hand in every town in the state. Every dealer will be furnished with a list price at which the books must be sold to the pupils—the exchange, the introductory and the retail price.

The exchange price is the price the pupil must pay for the new book when he surrenders an old book upon the same subject and of the same grade, heretofore legally adopted and in actual or contemplated use in the public schools of Oregon. This price remains in force to December 31, 1901. It is intended that a family having children attending a public school shall have the right to exchange old books in their possession for books as above stated.

The introduction price is the price the pupil must pay for the book when he has no old book to surrender in exchange. The period of introduction expires December 31, 1901.

The retail price is the price at which the books will be furnished to the pupil during the life of the contract.

The publishers, in bidding for the book contracts made an agreement to take up all the stocks of dealers and all old books, so that no one loses by reason of the adoption of new books.

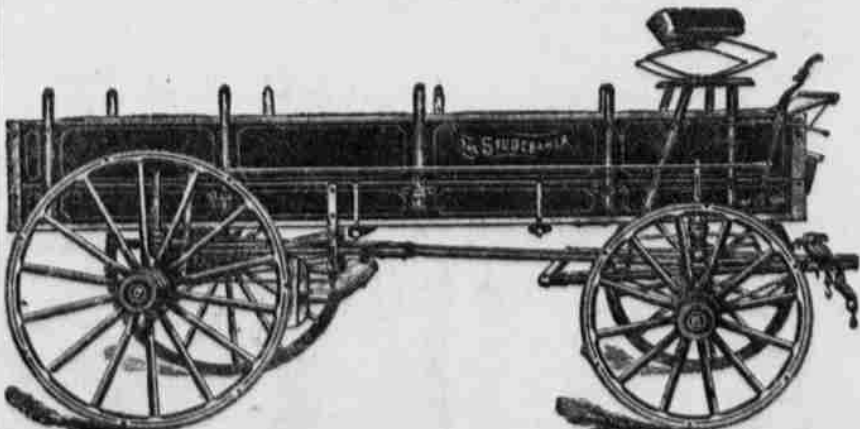
