

COUNTY COURT

January Term, 1902.

LAKEVIEW, Oregon, January 6, 1902. Court convened pursuant to adjournment, same officers present, when the following proceedings were had, to wit: In the matter of apportioning the tax for the year 1901, for Lake county, Oregon, the Court made the following estimate for the running expenses for the year commencing January 1, 1901, and ending December 31, 1901.

In consideration of the above estimate: It is ordered by the court that the levy be made as follows, to wit: For county purposes (ten mills) .010, For interest and redemption co. warrants (four mills) .004, For school purposes (five mills) .005, For road purposes (one and three-tenths) .013, For school library purposes (one-fifteenth mill) .00067.

On each dollar of taxable property of Lake county, Oregon, as returned by the assessor, and equalized by the county board of equalization. It appearing to the court from the statement of the county clerk on file herein, showing the number of sculpis presented, the number and amount of warrants issued commencing November 9, 1901, and ending January 6, 1902, both inclusive, and further from the affidavits and sculpis presented, that such statement is true and correct, numbering 1109 sculpis and amounting to the sum of \$2329.90.

It is therefore ordered that said statements be and the same are hereby approved. In the matter of the appointment of county physician. The court having opened and examined the bids on file of the several physicians finds as follows, to wit:

That Dr T V Hall has filed the lowest and best bid, to wit: To furnish professional services and medicines, wines, liquors, and such other stimulants as may be required; to attend all coroner's inquests, and examination of insane for the period of one year; to all paupers within a distance of twenty miles of Lakeview for the sum of \$8.35 per month.

Also agrees to attend such other paupers as the court or any member thereof may deem necessary outside said twenty mile limit for fifteen cents per mile traveled. It is therefore ordered that Dr T V Hall be and he is hereby awarded the contract for county physician for Lake county, Oregon, for the period of one year, and to receive for his services the amount above stated.

It appearing to the court that Mrs. Ruth Penland has filed the only bid to care for the paupers of Lake county, Oregon, to wit: To board, lodge, nurse and care for all county charges of Lake county, Oregon, for the weekly sum of \$4.75 for each of said paupers for the year 1902: It is ordered that Mrs. Ruth Penland be awarded the custody of such paupers for the year 1902, and to receive for such services the amount above named.

Whereas, the Lake County Examiner has filed the only list of bonafide subscribers, it is therefore ordered that the Lake County Examiner be and it is hereby awarded the contract to publish the county proceedings for the year ending January 1, 1903.

Ordered by the court that warrants be drawn upon the treasurer in payment of the following allowed claims, to wit: Ayers, Whitworth & Ayers, mdse \$6.15, J M Martin, com sal and per deim \$4.00, S J Prose com sal and per deim \$20.80.
