Predictions were made at Omaha of the paroxysmic mischievous effects of the blizzard that swept over Nebraska on the 23rd and 24th ultimo, and were soon realized. In the West & C. region of America the snow was measured in inches throughout a large portion of the States, except the northeast quarter, it was expected that the loss of cattle would be enormous, but no loss was sustained. In the northwest, however, heavy losses are reported from Kinnickinnic and Banner and Bassett and Bertrand, the heart of the cattle district suffered big losses. It was 25 degrees below and a blizzard raged.
