It is therefore ordered that a license be, and the Clerk of this Court is hereby ordered and directed to issue a license to the said M. C. Carrier to sell spirituous, malt and vinous liquors in quantities less than one gallon at Paisley, in Chewaucan Precinct, Lake County, Oregon, for a period of six months from March 9, 1902.

It is resolved: For the purpose of constructing and maintaining a telephone line between Ashland, Oregon and Lakeview, Oregon, and other points, the right is granted to H. V. Gates and his assigns, to conduct a telephone and telegraph business in Lake County, Oregon, and to place and maintain on the public highways of said Lake County in such manner and position as to not hinder, delay or obstruct in any manner the free use by the traveling public of said highways, poles, wires and other appliances for the transmission of electricity for telephone and telegraph purposes; provided that construction must begin on or before June 1st, 1902, otherwise this right shall be null and void.
