Nevada, California & Oregon Trains Now Running to Madeline, 105 filles From Lakeview.

Madeline, the new terminus of the Nevada, California & Oregon Railway, was opened as a station, with an agent, on April 1st. a d on and after that date Madeline will be the freight entrepot for all points which have been served by Termo. Trains will leave Reno daily (except Sundays) at 9 a. m., arr ving at Madeline at 8 p. m; and from Madeline daily (except Sandays , at 7:15 a. m., arriving at Reno at 5:25 p. m., Amedee being the point where dinner can be had either on the north or south bound trip. This time card will make good -onnection with ampletime to spare with the Southern Pacific trains passing Reno from the east and west, provided the S. P. Co. trains are on time at Reno.

It might be said also in this connection that while the Alturas and Lakeview passengers will connect with the stages and trains at Madeline, yet the stage line of A. P. Cross will, until July 1, operate and carry the mails via Termo for Fort Bidwell, Cedarville and Eagleville. What route the stages will take on and after July 1, the date of the new postoffice department contract, is not yet known It is understood, however, that there is some talk of buildin a road direct from Madeline to Eagleville, in which case Eagleville, Cedarville and Fort Bidwell will be served with mail that way. If the contemplated road is not built, then the mail route will, no doubt, be by way of Alturas to Cedarville, thence to Fort Bid well; Eagleville and points south thereof being served from Cedarville.

One of Boston's Benevalent Societies That Has Over a Thousand Members.

AN ANIMAL RESCUE LEAGUE.

A beautiful charity which is conducted by a Boston organization is described by the Beacon. It consists of extending relief to neglected and suffering cats and dogs. The society is known as, the Animal Rescue league. Why, it was first formed, in February, 1899, there were 110 members, both men and women. The number now exceeds a thousand. The president is a woman, Mrs. Huntington Smith. The league is able to rent a house for the care of its proteges, pay an agent and his wife to live there, and hire two other assistants. In the course of a year the league has received and cared for between 5,000 and 6,000 cats and dogs. On one day as many as 74 were brought to its doors.

The members of the society either rescue the suffering creatures themselves or report the cases promptly. And, the poor animals having been provided with a temporary home, outsiders are invited to inspect the place and its occupants and, if prompted to do so from kind motives, to take any of the animals away to a new home. The managers are serupulous, however, about giving a cat or a dog to anyone who is not likely to use it well. A woman who wanted a dog for her two-year-old baby to play with was met with a polite refusal.

The need of such an institution has long been felt by the people of humane instincts who are often on the streets and are quick to observe distress. It was impracticable for such persons to carry to their own homes all the neglected cats and dogs which they might encounter. It was much better to have an independent asylum. Occasionally a case is found for which something besides food, shelter and medical attendance is necessary. A kitten that had been thrown from a roof broke its hip and lay out in a field for three days, unable to crawl. With the best of care recovery was out of the question Accordingly, the

poor thing was put out of its misery. In fact, this course is found necessary every day.
