JOINT REPRESENTATIVES.

The Oregonian says that a most equitable distribution of Legislative representatives has been made in the Senatorial and Representative districts. Wasco county is in two joint Representative districts, and participated in the nomination of six Representatives. District No. 21 is composed of Wasco, Crook, Klamath and Lake counties. In the selection of Representatives in district No. 21 it was agreed that Klamath and Lake should name one and Wasco two. Klamath and Lake agreed on R. A. Emmett, while Wasco was a unit in favor of N. Whealdon and J. N. Burgess. All the delegates concurred in the selections made, and there was no contest.

As the matter now stands, every county in these two districts, with the exception of Lake, has a resident Representative in the Legislature, and Lake county's delegates were agreeable to the selection of Mr. Emmet from Klamath.

The Dr. Daly campaign "sack" has been opened in Lake county. Last Saturday and Sunday demonstrated the fact in Lakeview.
