O. B. Gates, superintendent of construction of the new telephone line to be built by the Midway Telephone and Telegraph Company from Ashland across the Cascades via Barron, Soda Spring and Shake to Klamath Falls and Lakeview, began the actual work of construction today, with a force of several men. The poles for the distance from Ashland to the timber will be furnished from the Reeser saw mill, and for the remainder of the distance across the mountains will be supplied by contracts, which have been let for some time to timber men along the route. Contracts have also been let for the delivery of the wire from Ashland along the route across the Cascades and the first load left here this morning. It is expected that with the force now employed the progress made in setting the poles and stringing the wires will amount to about one mile per day.—Ashland Tidings, April 28th.
