The Indian War Veterans have been recognized at last through the special efforts and hard work of Hon. Thomas H. Tongue, the brilliant Congressman from this district. The House Committee on pensions, on May 21st, ordered a favorable report on the long pending Indian War Veteran bill which passed the Senate on February 18th. The provisions of the act provide for the pensioning of the surviving officers and enlisted men who served in the Oregon and Washington Indian wars from 1851 to 1856, and to surviving and unmarried widows of the officers and men. Representative Tongue is now endeavoring to induce Speaker Henderson to set a day for the consideration of the bill and feels confident of its passage. Never before has this bill been in such a favorable position, and stood such a good show of passing. Had it gone through as reported a year ago, it would have afforded little benefit to the Oregon veterans. As now reported, it is all that has been asked. President Roosevelt is anxious to have the bill passed and has had a conference with Speaker Henderson on the subject.

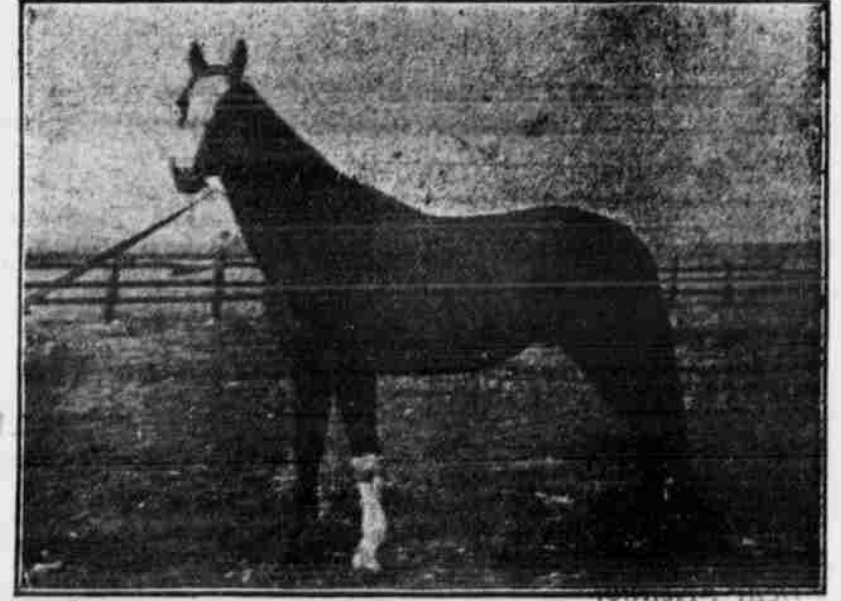
